

# Colour Wheel Granny Square



15th August is the annual Granny Square Day, hosted by Simply Crochet Magazine, celebrating all things granny square.

This pattern is my 2024 contribution to this day.



## Materials

The star of the show in this pattern is the yarn dyed by Lynzi of Hooking Marvellous Yarns. 100% bamboo 4 ply yarn in colourway Pink Rainbow, available from [www.hookingmarvellous.co.uk](http://www.hookingmarvellous.co.uk). I paired it with a plain 4 ply cotton to allow the yarn to take centre stage.

- 4ply yarn (or that of your preference)
- 3.5mm hook (or that of your preference)
- Scissors
- Needle for weaving in ends

## Gauge

Gauge is not important for this pattern. Please use whatever yarn and hook size that you would like to, bearing in mind that this will change the size of your resulting granny square.

My square measured 3"/8cm across and used barely any yarn - my scales couldn't detect the weight it was so light! My guess would be around 5g of yarn per square in 4ply weight.

## Stitches

This pattern is written using UK crochet terms. If you prefer to use US terms, please see the US terms version that is also available.

ch ~ chain  
dc ~ double crochet (US single crochet)  
htr ~ half treble crochet (US half double crochet)  
tr ~ treble crochet (US double crochet)  
dtr - double treble crochet (US treble crochet)  
sl st ~ slip stitch  
sp ~ space  
st ~ stitch  
sk ~ skip

- Square brackets [ ] denote that you repeat what is inside the brackets for the number of times written outside of the brackets.
- Round brackets ( ) denote that you do the information inside the brackets into one stitch.

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## Pattern

All rounds are worked right side up.

Ch 4. Sl st to the first ch to form a ring.

**Round 1:** Ch 4 (counts as a dtr).  
19dtr into the ring. Sl st to the top of the ch 4 to join.  
(20 dtr)

**Round 2:** Ch 1 (does not count as a st). Dc between each dtr. Sl st to first dc to join.  
(20 dc)

**Round 3:** Ch 3 (counts as a tr).  
Tr into the same st. 2tr in each st around. Sl st to the top of ch 3 to join.  
(40 tr)





**Round 4:** Ch 1 (does not count as a st). Dc between each tr, placing 2dc in the 10th, 20th, 30th and 40th sp. Sl st to first dc to join. (44 dc)

Change colour.

**Round 5:** Ch 1 (does not count as a st). Htr in the same st. Htr, tr, tr, dtr, (dtr, ch 2, dtr), dtr, tr, tr, htr, htr. [Htr, htr, tr, tr, dtr, (dtr, ch 2, dtr), dtr, tr, tr, htr, htr] repeat 3 times. Sl st to first htr to join. Fasten off. (48 sts, 4x ch 2 sp)



I really hope you make this square and get creative with it. I encourage you to play with colour and make something glorious.

I used the pattern to make a scarf, using a join-as-you-go method utilising drop loops, where I joined each square at set points as I was crocheting round 5.
